	MAIN BUSINESS	
1	NATURE RESERVES Bothenhampton Nature Reserve Cllr GS referred to letter from Mr Snelgrove (DIGS), who has been undertaking clearance work within Wanderwell Quarry by the Lime Kiln and Information Panel. The Clerk confirmed a letter has been written to Mr Snelgrove thanking him for his work. Cllr GS said that he had noticed a tree that needed some attention and would	
	speak to the VFO about this.	Cllr GS

	Issue of dog fouling between the Valley Road entrance and the back of the lime kiln. The need for an additional dog bin was discussed at the TT&F sub- committee meeting held on the 29 th October and it was agreed at that meeting that no further dog bins would be provided. However, Cllr EB said that he would like another dog bin to be considered, and that we should ask the Lengthsman where he feels this could be most appropriately located, either at the top of the steps or at the bottom.	
	Cllr GS said that there are two points to consider, firstly relating to access (for the bins to be emptied) and secondly the cost of purchase and installation. Cllr JB said that an ideal location would be on the footpath at Valley View next to the nearest road (ie at the top of the steps).	
	Cllr JB agreed with Cllr EB and said that Jellyfields has two dog bins at both its main entrances.	
	The Clerk said she would put onto the Finance and Funding Agenda.	Clerk
	Mr Snelgrove also reported on a landslip. Cllr GS said that warning notices were probably not needed as there did not appear to be any danger to the public.	
	Cllr JB suggested that a geological noticeboard could be erected at some point in the future giving information about the quarry to visitors.	
	Jellyfields Nature Reserve	
	Cllr JB reported that an overgrown path had now been cleared.	
2	JOHN HOLT PLAY AREA	
	The Main Committee Meeting in September agreed that up to £3,000 could be made available for the purchase of the new (older children) swings. The Clerk had prepared three quotes for consideration by OSPA councillors. There was discussion around all the quotes provided.	
	Recommendation to Main Committee – That the quote from GL Jones be ratified. Once ratified by the PC, the Clerk will progress this to secure the quoted price. As agreed, the community will be invited to raise the remaining amount.	
	Playground Inspector Report - several matters arose (mainly relating to the gate), Cllr GS will discuss with the Lengthsman.	
	Plastic barriers left by Dorset Council have now been collected after Cllr GS's request.	
	Preservative needs to be applied to the legs of the basket swing and to the seats/tables. Cllr GS will discuss with the playground inspector.

3	JOHN GUNDRY PLAY AREA	
	Playground Inspector Report - several matters arose (mainly relating to bark coverage and access), and the concrete around the swings. Cllr CA has met Playdale's engineer, and the parish council has asked Playdale to provide written confirmation that should the swings need further attention, the relevant parts would be replaced, and labour would be provided free of charge.	
	Cllr CA's suggestion for redesign – the redesign suggestion to re-organise the play area to reduce the amount of bark chippings and improve access was discussed and Cllr CA's redesign suggestion was approved, and he is asked to progress this.	Cllr CA
4	LOWER WALDITCH PLAY AREA	
	Playground Inspector Report - several matters arose (mainly relating to the pathway weeds and small hole in the path (by Viking Swing)). A repair kit to repair the hole has been purchased. The local group are going to find someone to repair the hole, this could be the Playground Inspector. The log circle has been removed.	
	The Friends of Lower Walditch Committee intends to plant apple trees and hornbeam into the orchard area. The Clerk confirmed that she had dealt with a request from the Group to draw down the S106 monies of £130.74 for various trees. This is ongoing.	
5	TREES	
	Cllr GS mentioned the plans that The Hyde has for its grounds in the planting of twenty parkland trees and a shelter belt of about 100 trees, including access to the public in the future. There could be a footpath created along part of Sycamore Way to facilitate access. Cllr GS reminded councillors to be mindful of potential sites on which trees could be planted in Spring.	
6	ALLOTMENTS	
	Cllr GS said he had spoken to the owner of the greenhouses in Duck Street and discussed the possibility of using the site for community activity such as allotments. The owner is currently considering how to take forward the site, including the possibility of some form of commercial activity, and Cllr GS will remain in touch. It was agreed that it would be a good subject to discuss with David Pencheon when he attends the main committee meeting in November. Several local people had expressed an interest in an allotment following the Mayor's article in The Bridge. the Clerk is maintaining a list.
