#### 8. REPORTS

a. Footpaths & roads. 30mph signs in Crock Lane are obscured by hedge growth and some are broken. Page 116

Quarry Lane. Cleaning schedule is for six sweeps per year but has only been done twice in 1994 and not at all this year so far.

The gullies in Waldicth Lane are now blocked with silt and need to be cleaned out.

The Clerk was instructed to report these defects to the County Surveyor.

- b. Street lighting.
  Following a complaint raised in the democratic half hour it was agreed that the contractor should be approached to see if the newly installed lamp columns in Walditch Lane at the new development and the junction of Walditch Lane/Walditch Road/Asker Mead could be painted a colour more condusive to the immediate surroundings, also what action they intend to take to ensure there is no intrusion to the surrounding dwellings in Manor Fields. Concern was also expressed at the number of columns that have been installed at the junction. It would seem that the number is excessive for the size of the junction.
- c. John Holt Play Area.
  A complaint was received from two parents on the safety aspect of the newly installed play equipment viz:

(1) the end of the slide is 19 inches from the ground, thus any child coming down the slide and coming off the end has a drop of 19 inches before meeting the safety surfacing.

(2) the swing seats are 2 feet 4 inches off the ground which makes it almost impossible for a child to get onto the seat unaided.

(3) the lookout climbing frame has an inviting pole at the back for children to slide down like a fireman's pole, only to find there is a bar across the inside about 21 inches above the ground which effectively stops small children before their feet have got to the ground.

The Council were most concerned over these complaints and the Clerk was instructed to arrange a meeting between a representative from the suppliers, Wicksteed Ltd, the National Playing Fields Association, the full council and any interested parents as a matter of urgency.

- d. Neighbourhood Watch. An incident was reported last Sunday of a number of youths removing the warning cones in the vicinity of the new development in Walditch Lane and using them as skate board obstacles and the stoning of the street lights. The Clerk was instructed to write to the Bridport police and inform them accordingly.
- e. Conservation and Open Spaces. The path has now been completed and the steps reinstated in the Nature Reserve. A further session of bat and bird box making has been arranged.
