2	Main Business	
	 Feedback from Chair on the work of Volunteer Footpaths Officer (VFO). Cllr GS provided a summary of the work carried out by the VFO including his work at the Bothenhampton Nature Reserve. Cllr GS said he looks forward to liaising properly with the Lengthsman, the VFO and other councillors as applicable. 	
	Cllr MW and Cllr GS agreed to meet with the VFO and Lengthsman jointly in future when the restrictions ease as this would prove beneficial. Cllr MW will arrange the next routine meeting on his own.	
	Cllr MW referred to an email from the VFO advising councillors that footpath W5/23 and steps to the bridge had collapsed, Cllr MW advised VFO to contact Dorset Council.	
	 Double Yellow Lines on Chestnut Road The application of double yellow lines was discussed and that there is a formal process to go through to examine the need for the yellow lines. It was decided to investigate the legal requirements for the application of yellow lines, there are strict highway legislations for yellow lines and the request may not fall within the guidance. This item will feature within the forthcoming Parish Plan to be progressed in 2022. 	
	 Hollow Way signage 20mph and Slow Sign This was discussed, and it was thought that a reduction to 20mph would be difficult (as it was for Crock Lane). This item will feature within the forthcoming Parish Plan to be progressed in 2022. 	
	Cycle Path Burton Road / Extension to the Hollow Way to Burton Road Cycle Route This was discussed and Cllr JB mentioned he had spoken to a councillor	
	from Burton Bradstock who said that they had been unable to gain permission from local farmers to extend the cycle way over their land. This item will feature within the forthcoming Parish Plan to be progressed in 2022.

	30mph (reduction in speed limit from 40mph) on Sea Road South at Maple Gardens	
	 This was discussed and the practicality of providing different speed limits along the Sea Road South. This suggestion was dismissed. 	
	 Hire of Brush cutter for VFO to clear Tony's Track Cllr CA raised this, as it had been referred back to the committee from the Finance and Funding Committee. Cllr CA advised that there is no objection to the money being made available for the hire but questioned the wisdom of proceeding with this course of action. He said that historically the maintenance of Tony's Track is part of the Lengthsman's duties, to withdraw it and place it with the VFO could set a precedent for the future. In as much that if the VFO no longer wished to continue with the role, the parish council would need to find someone else to maintain Tony's Track 	
	Cllr MW confirmed that he had asked the Lengthsman n to brush cut Tonys Track however the Lengthsman had advised him to hire a brush cutter as he did not have one.	
	The Clerk expressed surprise that the Lengthsman did not already have a brush cutter (bearing in mind the nature of his job),	
	Cllr MW also said that when he had asked for the work to be done, the Lengthsman had referred to the contracted hours and that if he were to do the work the hours could well be exceeded as a lot of his time is now used emptying litter and dog bins.	Clir MW
	The Clerk advised the sub-committee that they should wait for Bridport Town Council to invoice for any extra hours the Lengthsman works. Cllr MW agreed to ask the Lengthsman to carry out the work along Tony's Track when necessary.

	Any Other Business Cllr MW referred to the letter that Cllr JB wrote to Bridport Town Council and that was copied to Dorset Council regarding Footpath W1/13. A copy of the text of the letter appears below on page 5. BTC responded and advised us to write to Dorset Council. The Clerk left a message on the DC Portal on 21st January 2021. Cllr JB advised that the same issue has been raised in the BANP project dealing with cycleways - this may prove difficult to achieve as the pavement is too narrow, which is frustrating as it makes sense to extend. The Clerk to chase.	Clerk
	Date of next meeting The meeting dates were slightly adjusted, and a new set of dates was agreed. The next meeting will be 30 th April at 3pm via Zoom.	
	Text from Letter to Bridport Town Council dated 11 th January 2021 Residents of the parish have requested a pedestrian crossing on Sea Road South where Footpath W1/13 ends and Footpath W5/5 begins, currently crossing at this point is dangerous. This is some 100m south of a light-controlled pedestrian crossing at East Road roundabout. Common sense indicates that it may not be welcomed by the Highways Agency.	
	Alternatively, the parish council suggests that there could be a footpath along Sea Road South from the end of Footpath W1/13 to the Fire Station, about 25m in length, to join the existing pavement that leads to the existing light-controlled crossing. A waymark could indicate this diversion.	
	This will create access across the meadow to the existing pedestrian crossing where people from Walditch and Bothenhampton will be able to cross the A35 safely.
