	MAIN BUSINESS		
1	Nature Reserves:		
	Jellyfields Nature Reserve		
	Cllr GS confirmed that he has visited this nature reserve and did not notice any significant problems. Cllr JB said that the nature reserve path was very overgrown in the winter months and has now been cleared by Bridport Town Council.		
	Bothenhampton Nature Reserve		
	The new dog bin has now been affixed at the top entrance and is being well used. Cllr EB said that he walks in the reserve every day and can see no issues of concern.		
	There was general agreement that when the transfer of the nature reserves has taken place, Bridport Town Council and the Parish Council will agree appropriate wording for signs that provide information to visitors (including 'no BBQs')		
	Cllrs GS and EB will visit the site on 30 <sup>th</sup> May with the VFO to identify work that could be done by the VFO and a group of volunteers.		
	Cllr GS recalled the tragic death of two young people earlier in the year and said that an inquest is due around June 2022. There may be some fresh media interest during this time.		
2	John Holt Play Area		
	Cllr GS referred to the Playground Inspector's report (Ken Hussey) which again identifies the gate to the play area as needing attention. Cllr GS said that the spring in the gate needs replacing, and he will encourage the Lengthsman to talk to the Inspector about this.	Cllr GS	
	Cllr GS confirmed that two trees had been planted in the play area during March 2022, one of which is to commemorate the Jubilee.  There was agreement that plaques displaying appropriate wording for the Jubilee should be purchased. See section 5 below.

2	John Holt Play Area (cont.)  Cllr GS confirmed that two new swings had been installed in the play area and children are using them.		
	Cllr GS also confirmed that arrangements had been made to hold a BBQ in the Play Area on the 4 <sup>th</sup> June 2022 to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.		
	Cllr GS said he may soon need to mobilise another volunteer work party to weed ivy from the stone wall in Quarry Lane, alongside the play area.		
3	John Gundry Play Area		
	Cllr GS referred to the Playground Inspector's report (Ken Hussey) and confirmed that there are no issues.		
	Councillors referred to the outline plan provided by Cllr CA to redesign the play area and to his new suggestion of hiring a contractor to carry out the work.		
	The Clerk will progress this with Cllr CA and identify a contractor (in addition to Ken Hussey) to carry out the redesign. It was suggested that the redesign might include getting rid of the bark altogether and using another surface material that would not need the constant raking and attention that bark does.	Clerk	
4	Lower Walditch Play Area		
	Cllr GS referred to the Playground Inspector's report (Ken Hussey) and confirmed that there are no issues.		
	Cllr GS said that the holes in the path have now been mended by PlayQuest. Fruit trees have been planted along the fence and new benches have been installed.		
5	Trees		
	Plaques for the two trees to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. not commemorate		
	The parish council has sought two quotes for plaques to accompany the trees purchased for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.		
	It was agreed that the Parish Council will purchase two brass plaques from Bridport Foundry. The Clerk was asked to progress this and to obtain proofs and a date by with the plaques may be available.	Clerk

5	TREES Slades Green		
	Cllr GS confirmed that he had visited the Slades Green site where the Parish Council had planted trees in 2021; there were no major issues to report.		
	There was general agreement that councillors should keep a look out for new planting sites in the parish for November 2022.		
	Howard Road Amenity Area		
	Cllr JB suggested planting a hazel hedge at the bottom of the Howard Road Amenity Area. It was agreed that some form of consultation should take place with the residents of the area and Cllr JB agreed to draft out a form of words in order that the Clerk can have a leaflet printed up.	Cllr JB/ Clerk	
	Cllr JB also suggested a renaming of the area, perhaps to Queen Elizabeth II meadow, or similar. This could be included as a consultation element on the leaflet.		
6	Allotments		
	Cllr GS said he had nothing to report other than to keep an eye and ear open for potential sites and confirmed that there is still interest from the community in obtaining allotments as we have been contacted recently from a prospective allotment holder asking for a progress report. We had reassured the correspondent that this remained on our agenda, and that we remained on the lookout for potential sites.		
7	ANY OTHER BUSINESS		
	Cllr JB confirmed that there will be a celebration on 5 <sup>th</sup> June in Walditch to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. A tree has been procured by the Walditch Village Hall Committee and this will be planted in the garden adjacent to the Village Hall.
